Defining TBW Volunteers

By becoming a volunteer at TBW, you will have the opportunity to be part of an organization that is providing experiential learning opportunities and social emotional support to youth of color in the Triangle area while using the bicycle as a means of seeing the world in a new and unique way. To maintain a safe, secure, and efficient work environment at TBW, we have defined Volunteer Types and requirements for our diverse volunteer base.

Volunteer Types and Onboarding Processes

Event Volunteers

Individuals interested in donating their time during special events and activities.

- 1. Complete <u>Volunteer Application</u> on website or sign up through school or organization volunteer tracking system
- 2. Receive email confirmation and details of event
- 3. Day of Event sign-in with Volunteer Coordinator and consent to pertinent agreements/waivers for specific service day/s
- 4. Receive a brief orientation and/or summary of duties and responsibilities for service day/s by coordinating supervisor

Capacity Building Volunteers

Individuals with a personal interest to donate their time and expertise for an extensive period.

Capacity Building Volunteers Onboarding Process

- 1. Complete Volunteer Application on website
- 2. Pass the National Sex Offender Check
- 3. Attend a Screening Interview
- 4. Read and Sign the TBW Adult Code of Conduct (page 7)
- 5. Read and Sign Waivers (page 6, 8, 9,10)
- 6. Complete Orientation and Quiz (50 minutes)
- 7. Start volunteering!

TBW Mentor/Coach

Individuals with a personal interest to donate their time and work directly with youth for an extensive period.

TBW Mentor/ Coach Onboarding Process

- 1. Complete Volunteer Application on website
- 2. Pass the National Sex Offender Check
- 3. Attend a Screening Interview
- 4. Pass a Background Check
- 5. Read and Sign the TBW Adult Code of Conduct (page 7)
- 6. Read and Sign Waivers (page 6, 8, 9,10)
- 7. Complete Sexual Harassment Webinar and Quiz (60 minutes)
- 8. Complete Orientation & Mentor Training and Quiz (80 minutes)
- 9. Start volunteering!

Volunteer Agreement:

I understand that I must adhere to the following requirements and policies to remain eligible to volunteer for Triangle Bikeworks. I must sign and return forms via email (volunteer@trianglebikeworks.org) or in person or by mail (117 West Main Street, Carrboro, NC 27514). Failure to do so may result in inability to volunteer at Triangle Bikeworks.

Orientation

Capacity Building Volunteers and TBW Mentors/Coach must complete their respective orientation powerpoint and quiz. The orientation process is designed to help volunteers understand TBW's guiding principles and to prepare you to effectively participate in TBW activities.

National Sex Offender Checks

All volunteers are required to pass the National Sex Offender check prior to the first day of volunteering.

Background Checks

Volunteers working directly with youth are required to complete a criminal history background check prior to the first day of volunteering. If a volunteer has offenses on their record and feels comfortable, we recommend discussing the nature of them with the Volunteer Coordinator. Background information about criminal records are confidential. The reports are only used for the purpose for which it was intended.

Sexual Harassment Webinar

This is required for TBW Mentors. The webinar is called "Safety 1st Webinar: Camp Staff Harassment Safety in the Age of #metoo". You must watch the webinar and complete the quiz prior to your first day of volunteering or you will not be eligible to start. NOTE: Capacity Building volunteers will be expected to know the Sexual Harassment expectations outlined in the Orientation Powerpoint.

Attendance

Expected to be present for every committed volunteer assignment.

Tardiness and Absences

As a volunteer, you are required to be punctual and present. If there is a circumstance where you are going to be late, please notify the Volunteer Coordinator immediately via phone or email. If there is a circumstance where you cannot fulfill the commitment, notify the Volunteer Coordinator at least 1 day prior to the day of service.

TBW Mentor/Coach:

- Mentoring, at its core, guarantees young people that there is someone who cares about them, assures them they are not alone in dealing with day-to-day challenges, and makes them feel like they matter.
- Mentors wear many hats, acting as delegators, role models, cheerleaders, policy enforcers, advocates, and friends. Mentors assume these different roles during the course of a relationship
- TBW Mentors have the option to participate in training rides and bike rides.
 On rides you are helping ensure safety, provide guidance & motivation. It can be challenging to cycle in a group so you need to have effective leadership skills and lots of patience.
 - *** TBW Mentor/Coach are required to have their own bike. Comfortable cycling on roads and/ or trails, knowledge of traffic laws and bike signals.
 - ***TBW mentors don't have to participate in bike rides.

Triangle Bikeworks Adult Code of Conduct

Adults within the Triangle Bikeworks (TBW) community agree to follow this code of conduct to maintain a culture of safety, responsibility and respect.

Maintain appropriate behavior for an adult associated with a Triangle Bikeworks by:

- Follow your training and TBW Policies, Rules and Guidelines at all times.
- Discrimination by TBW community members will not be tolerated. TBW prohibits discrimination and harassment of any type with regard to race, color, religion, age, sex, national origin, disability status, genetics, protected veteran status, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, or any other characteristic protected by federal, state or local laws.
- Work to be cognizant of inherent power dynamics within interactions (teacher, gender, race) and work to acknowledge and redistribute relative power
 - o Never engage in behavior that could be interpreted as "grooming behavior"
 - All 1:1 interaction between a youth and adult must be observable & interruptible. That is, they must take place someplace where another adult can see what is happening and intervene if the interaction looks inappropriate. For example, unless immediate family members, TBW community member should never meet 1:1 with youth for bike rides or other activities within or outside of the TBW season.
 - The 1:1 policy still applies for virtual communications. Keep communications transparent, accessible, professional and only via your official TBW platforms.
- Sexual harassment by TBW community member will not be tolerated. These forms of harassment
 include, but are not limited to: offensive or unwelcome sexual flirtations, advances or propositions,
 repeated verbal abuse of a sexual nature, graphic or degrading comments about an individual
 and/or their appearance. The display of sexually suggestive objects or pictures and any offensive or
 abusive physical contact will also not be tolerated.
- Participants' safety must be a priority at ALL times. It is imperative that we ensure that youth are behaving in a safe, responsible and respectful manner. If you see or hear something that in any way compromises the safety of our community, it is your job to step in and intervene. Address all concerns brought to your attention, including any observed prejudice or discriminatory behavior.
- Use your best judgment. If you have concerns that a task, project or activity you are working on is dangerous, or is not going to meet the agreed-upon objectives let the person in charge know.
- Regardless of your specific role, you are a role model and authority figure.
- Your primary role is to ensure the safety and then the success of participants within each activity.
- Be supportive. If a fellow TBW community member is struggling, it is expected that you support them.
- Be transparent. If you have a concern, share it with the person in charge. If the person in charge is the person with whom you have a concern, share it with TBW Board of Directors.
- Communicate. Be open to giving and receiving feedback.
- Listen to and respect the youth at all times. Promote appropriate relationships that are based on openness, honesty, trust and respect.
- Use positive and encouraging language.
- Ask before touching someone or someone else's bike, even if they have asked you for help.
- Be prompt and reliable.
